## **WHY ARE WE HERE?**

Art+Feminism is a global project improving content on cis and trans women, the arts, and feminism on Wikipedia.

This quick guide is for you. It's been designed to walk you through the first steps to organizing an event with our campaign.

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# WELCOME TO THE YEAR FIVE CAMPAIGN #AF5

## WHY ARE WE HERE?

The gender gap on Wikipedia is no secret. In 2011, The Wikimedia Foundation found that less than 10% of editors on the platform were women. When we're not represented in the writing and editing of the stories and records of people like us, the content gets messed up. The stories get mistold. We lose out on the real history. That's why we're here: to change it.

## WHO ARE YOU, THOUGH?

We are four co-lead organizers, Jacqueline Mabey, McKensie Mack, Michael Mandiberg, and Siân Evans, who are responsible for keeping Art+Feminism moving. A wise woman once said that every day you show up, you re-educate people as to who you are and what you believe in. This is what we believe.

## WHAT DO YOU DO?

Every year, during the month of March\*, organizers and new editors gather together in groups to learn how to edit Wikipedia. We create new articles and improve existing content. These events welcome people of all gender expressions and identities to participate. Our work is about centering the voices and histories of cis and trans women on the platform. When people sign up to participate, they are also signing on to center those narratives specifically.

## WHO PAYS FOR EVENTS?

We work with the Wikimedia Foundation to offer reimbursement for refreshments and childcare during events. Many of our organizers work with institutions who offer funding from their programming budgets to host edit-a-thons.

## WHAT TO EDIT?

Edit-a-thons are interesting communities when the content being edited is about the community. If you're at a school, is there a way you could include current curriculum in an event? If you are at an art space, could you use the current exhibitions as a point of departure? Some folks will come with what they want to edit in mind, but many won't so it helps to have some suggestions and research materials ready.

## WHAT WILL THIS GUIDE DO FOR ME?

Use this guide as a launching point to create an event suited to the needs of your community. Be bold. Listen to your gut. Show your work.

# 1.1: THE ONLY CHECKLIST YOU'LL EVER NEED

## **FIND A VENUE.**

We encourage you to use a free, public space for your event. This kind of event is a perfect program for libraries, museums, community led co-working spaces, and universities. Look into local public institutions and ask if they would be interested in partnering with you or adding the Edit-a-thon to their list of programs for the year. We are unable to provide funding to pay for venue costs.

## **SECURE THE DATE AND TIME**

This is an easy one. Consider your audience: schools often choose a weekday like Friday. Once you have a date and a time, the next step is to find a dope person experienced in Wikipedia who can help to lead trainings at your edit-a-thon.

## **CREATE YOUR WIKIPEDIA USERNAME AND PASSWORD**

## **REGISTER YOUR EVENT ON THE DASHBOARD**

## **CONTACT US (IF YOU NEED HELP) TO CONNECT YOU WITH A WIKIPEDIAN WHO CAN HOST TRAININGS DURING YOUR EVENT**

If you're hosting for the first time and need help finding an experienced Wikipediaian to lead your workshop, let us know! We'd be happy to help you find someone to lead. Even for us, sometimes finding a Wikipediaian can be difficult, so we encourage you to be bold, and use our training resources to help you find a Wikipediaian in your area who fits the needs of your community.

## **SUBMIT YOUR EVENT DETAILS ON OUR WEBSITE**

## **REQUEST ACCOUNT CREATOR STATUS FOR YOUR EVENT**

Wikipedia has a limit on the number of accounts that can be created in a day by one person. Encourage your event participants to register an account on Wikipedia prior before they come. You can also request permission to create accounts on Wikipedia so that you can do it the day of. Wikipedia's gender trouble is well-documented. In a 2011 survey, the Wikimedia Foundation found that less than 10% of its contributors were women. While the reasons for the gender gap are up for debate, the practical effect of this disparity is not: content is skewed by the lack of representation from women.

Let's change that.

#### How do I learn how to edit Wikipedia?

If you have 2 hours, go to a training and add a well cited paragraph to an article in your area of expertise.  
If you have 2-4 hours, consider creating a new article. Be sure to gather your reliable sources and check in with an experienced Wikipedian to ensure that your article meets Wikipedia's *notability guidelines*.  
Don't know what to work on? We have books and articles available for inspiration!

#### What if I have questions?
